

Crumble

Crumble is the perfect scarf for a cake of yarn that has long color repeats. If you are like me then you have a bunch of these cakes in your stash but no idea what to make with them. This scarf solves that problem and only uses 1 cake.

The scarf is knit on the bias and has a bit of texture to give you a nice semi-mindless knit.

Material Needed

- 140 grams/5 ounces 260 yards/238m of 4-medium (worsted weight) yarn.
- US 10 (6 mm) knitting needles
- Yarn needle

Size

- 5" x 83" (12 cm x 210 cm) Size will vary based on your yarn choice. I used a cake of Premier Candy Shop yarn to get the dimensions of 5" x 83".

Abbreviations:

- K - Knit
- P - Purl
- YO - Yarn Over
- SSK - Slip next 2 stitches knitwise, insert left needle into the front of the 2 slipped stitches on the right needle and knit together.
- K1TBL - Knit stitch through the back loop

Pattern

Cast on 23 stitches

(for a wider scarf add stitches in multiples of 4)

Row 1: K1, YO, K to last 3 stitches, SSK, K1

Row 2: K5, (P1, K3) to last 2 stitches, K1TBL, K1

Row 3: K1, YO, K to last 3 stitches, SSK, K1

Row 4: K3, (P1, K3) to last 4 stitches, P1, K1, K1TBL, K1

Repeat rows 1-4 until scarf is the desired length.

Bind Off

Weave in Ends
